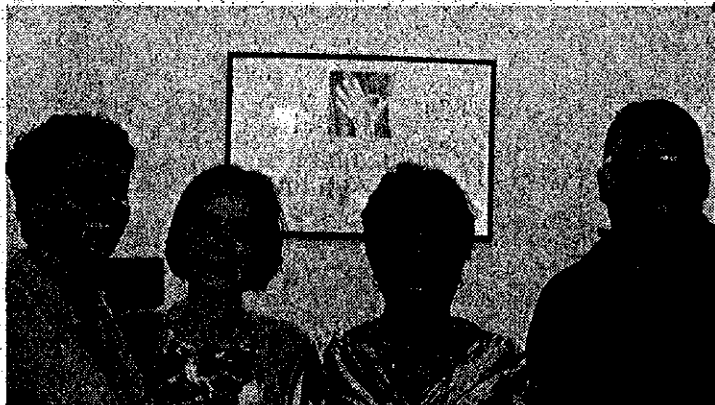

Peninsula Family Service seeks volunteers

SAN MATEO, CA — Peninsula Family Service is now accepting applications for volunteer counselors in its Senior Peer Counseling Program. Training begins September 26, 2011, at Peninsula Family Service, located at 24 Second Avenue in San Mateo. Volunteers must be at least 55 years of age and residents of San Mateo County. The training takes place over nine weeks, with volunteers meeting two days a week for 3 hours each session. A licensed professional leads the sessions, which consist of topics such as basics of social and family relations, self-awareness, listening skills, understanding depression and other challenges of aging.
