PENINSULA FAMILY SERVICE TO HOST SECOND EDITION OF THE THOUGHT LEADER SERIES FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT FOR ALL: HOW DO WE MAKE TRUE PROGRESS?

San Mateo, CA – May 11th, 2018. Peninsula Family Service, a local non-profit organization with 68 years of presence in four Bay Area counties, is hosting the second edition of its Thought Leader Series on June 6th, 2018 at the Silicon Valley Community Foundation community space in San Mateo. The event runs from 9:30 AM until 1:00 PM.

“Due to the increasing costs of living, many of our neighbors in the Bay Area are fighting an uphill battle to continue to live in the place they call home”, says Heather Cleary, CEO of Peninsula Family Service, “this conference and working lunch on Financial Education is a way to bring together our community, generate discussion and find ways to bring financial education services and products to those who need them most.” This is the second edition in Peninsula Family Service’s Thought Leader Series, a series of events that aim to inspire, inform and stimulate discussion on topics of vital concern to the community.

The event’s keynote speaker is José Quiñonez, Mission Asset Fund Founder/CEO and 2016 MacArthur Fellow. He is a renowned financial services innovator, with extensive work in moving underbanked populations into a pathway to mainstream financial services and improvement of their financial stability.

Other speakers are Yuliya Rzad, Program Specialist with the Office of Financial Empowerment of the Consumer Finance Protection Bureau (CFPB); Rob Lajoie, Vice President of Financial Empowerment for Peninsula Family Service; Dr. Vera Jacobson-Lundeborg, D.Ed., Director for the Career and Technical Education program of the San Mateo County Office of Education (SMCOE); and Keith Ogden, ESQ., Senior Attorney for the Housing Program at the Community Legal Services in East Palo Alto (CLSEPA). Maeve Elise Brown, Founder & Executive Director of Housing and Economic Rights Advocates (HERA) will serve as emcee for the event and panel facilitator.

“The lack of access to financial education, sky-high interest rates and predatory lending push those who struggle to make ends meet into a cycle of debt with devastating consequences. With this event, we are looking for alternatives to bring education and services to those who need it most in our community,” says Rob Lajoie, Vice President of Financial Empowerment at Peninsula Family Service.
