

THE CHALLENGES AND OUR RESPONSE TO COVID-19

The challenges of 2020 have made our programs even more critically important to so many in our community. The ongoing programs of Peninsula Family Service (PFS), in early learning, financial empowerment and older adult services, have pivoted in innovative ways and continued at a high-level of effectiveness.

All of our early learning families and children are at low-income or poverty level. The majority of our older adult and financial empowerment program participants are also at low-income level. Since the beginning of the pandemic 67% of all financial empowerment participants, and a similar level for all early learning families, have suffered loss of jobs or reduced levels of income. Food insecurity has skyrocketed. Basic expenses, including rent, have been impossible to meet.

16,145

Year-round, food boxes are provided at PFS sites every week. Now, at this time when food insecurity is at even more critical levels, nonprofit partners, individual and organizational volunteers have stepped up to provide meals and food boxes at PFS sites with a grand total of 16,145 meals and food boxes distributed since March 2020.
